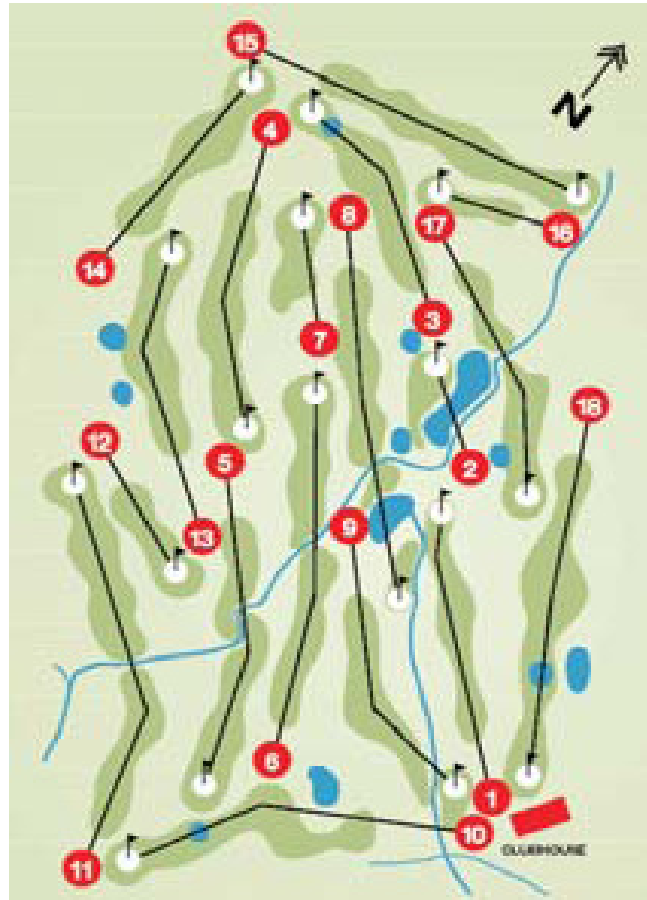


Course Plan & Local Rules



A ball is out of bounds if it lies:

- Beyond the nearest inside points at ground level of all boundary fences (excluding angled supports) and white stakes.
- Over the boundary wall on the left of the 14th hole.
- Beyond the inside edge of the white line behind the 18th green and the 1st and 10th tees.

- Water hazards which are marked with yellow stakes or not marked, are ordinary water hazards.
- Water hazards marked with red stakes are lateral water hazards.

- Staked trees, fences protecting plantations, manhole covers, signs, seats, litter bins, tee markers, sprinkler heads, electricity poles and bells.
- All roads and paths surfaced with stone or astroturf.
- The pump house on the 17th hole. A ball should be lifted and dropped within one club length of the nearest point of relief, not nearer the hole, without penalty.

Stones in bunkers are moveable obstructions (Rule 24).

All parts of bridges within the margins of water hazards are integral parts of the course. A ball lying on a bridge between the margins should be played "as it lies" or dropped with penalty as per Rule 28.

- If a player's ball lies in any area of Ground Under Repair from which play is prohibited, or if such an area interferes with a player's stance or swing, the player must take relief under Rule 25.
- Trenches or lines marking such areas are within the Ground Under Repair.

Environmentally sensitive areas will be marked and should be treated as Ground Under Repair, see 6.
